After talking to the Lord Mayor and explaining what the scheme involved they were very pleased to have the opportunity to visit the Council Chamber. Later that evening the Committee took them out for a pizza which gave us the chance to hear about their experiences in their schools and also ask them about their impressions of Bristol. We rounded off the evening by taking them to a concert by Avawaves held in the Foyer of The Beacon.


# UWE Student Project


#### Shared Memories Project
