Make a mask in the style of Lady JDay.




PERSPECTIVES LA VUE DE MA FENÊTRE

This painting is by an artist, Albert Marquet who was born in 1875 in Bordeaux. His painting, La fenêtre à la Goulette, is in the Bordeaux Musée de Beaux Arts. It is a painting from his window when he was living in Tunisia and gives an idea of what it would have been like to live during this period. This painting looks quite simplistic in style.

Create a snapshot of your life from the window you are looking from right now. Don't include too much of the window - rather use it to focus on the perspective of what is beyond the window.







Make a Mask inspired by Lady J Day



Things you need to make the mask base:

- Template print out
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Thick card (an old cereal box works well)
- Lollipop stick
- Sticky tape

Stick the mask template on a piece of thin card with a glue stick and then cut out.

Cut out the eye holes – poke a hole in the middle of the eye shape with your scissors and then cut around the outline.

Use some sticky tape to stick a lollipop stick to the back of the mask so you can hold it up in front of your face.

Ideas to decorate a mask inspired by Lady J Day's graffiti artwork:

Cut it out! (use cardboard, thick card or paper)

- Nose triangle or rectangle
- Eyes ovals and circles
- Mouth can you cut lips shapes?
- Ears semi-circles

Add some colour!

- Paint
- Crayons
- Felt pens
- Oil or chalk pastels


Recycled materials!

- Cardboard shapes
- Plastic lids


RESEARCH A SPORTSPERSON








WRITE A STORY




DEVENIR INGÉNIEURE

The most spectacular of Bordeaux's bridges is the **Pont Jacques Chaban-Delmas**, Europe's longest-span vertical-lift bridge which was opened in 2013 in Bordeaux, spanning the River Garonne. The central lift span is 117-metre-long and can be lifted vertically up to 53 metres to let tall ships pass underneath. You need to see this bridge to believe it.

Take a look at the bridges - what can you see that is similar or different? It might be the engineering or it might be their locations?




THE BATTLE OF THE ARCHITECTS

Engineering and architecture are joined together as without the designs of buildings, the buildings cannot be built. In Bordeaux there are some incredible examples of architecture from the past but also much more recent buildings which give the city a modern feel. The Stadium Matmut Atlantique which is the city's main football stadium has looked to nature; each of the small lines are supposed to look like trees and the Cultural centre known as MÉCA is the city's newest architectural addition. Which do you prefer?









Your challenge though is to consider which of the buildings of Bordeaux are best? Would you rate the modern higher than the old and historic.

Set your own criteria to judge them? What would you say? Best design? Best materials? Fits in with the rest of the local area?

Choose four buildings in Bordeaux - 2 new and 2 old and judge them on your scale? If you have time find out a little more about each building and write a short fact file on each. Perhaps you could have a balanced discussion in class on which is best - classic or modern architecture? Which would you choose?







CO-ORDINATES GAME


Using the map coordinations, write where the building are located.






WHAT DOES FRIENDSHIP MEAN?
